#### Wheel of Reincarnation

The Great Wheel of Rebirth summarizes the Buddhist doctrine of karma: an endless cycle of reincarnation into higher or lower forms of life according to one's past deeds. In this sculpture the demon Mara, personifying existence, holds the wheel in his jaws and arms. The wheel is supported from below by personifications (I. to r.) of greed (an official), evil (a soldier), foolishness (a monkey), and lust (a woman). Six Buddha-rays emanate from the wheel, signifying that enlightenment, the goal of all Buddhist practice, enables the seeker to escape from the eternal cycle of birth and death.

Without out evidence, the statement "Hell exists and humans who are not saved will spend eternity there" may in fact be nothing more than pure nonsense.


Authoritative, expert, evidence is the key. Without out it we're just whistling in the dark and there is no way to determine whether any competing religious claim is true or false.



#### The New Testament is a Library of First Century Documents

- We won't naively assume 'inspiration' or 'infallibility' of the New Testament records and then by circular reason attempt to prove what we previously assumed.
- Four Gospels contain Historical Biographical information regarding the life, teaching and deeds of Jesus of Nazareth.
  - . Two of the Gospels (Matthew and John) were written by eye witnesses.
  - The Gospel of Luke was compiled by interviewing and recording the testimony of eye witnesses.
  - Gospel of Mark scholars debate whether John Mark was an eyewitness.
    There is good reason to believe that Mark's Gospel account were the preaching notes of the Apostle Peter.
- The same standard tests for determining the reliability of every other ancient text apply to the New Testament documents. (science of Historiography)



## Bibliographical Test


Length of Time Between When the 'Autograph' was written and the earliest copy of the document

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## Time Span?


What is the time span from the date of the originals to the date of the first copy that is 'extant'?

Our earliest copies of New Testament documents date to the early 2nd Century.

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







## Our Earliest Manuscripts

- John Rylands MS 130 A.D. portions of the Gospel of John
- Bodmer Papyrus II 150 A.D. most of the Gospel of John
- Chester Beatty Papyri 200 A.D. major portions of the N.T.
- Codex Vaticanus 325 AD entire Bible
- Codex Sinaiticus 350 A.D. Entire NT, Half of OT













#### External Sources

- Josephus, The Antiquities AD 90-95
  - At this time there was a wise man who was called Jesus. And his conduct was good and he was know to be virtuous. And many people from among the Jews and other nations became his disciples. Pilate condemned him to be crucified and to die. And those who had become his disciples did not abandon his discipleship. They reported that he had appeared to them three days after his crucifixion and that he was alive; accordingly, he was perhaps the messiah concerning whom the prophets recounted wonders.

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






### Other External Sources

- Pliny the Younger, AD 112
  - They (the Christians) were in the habit of meeting on a certain fixed day before it was light, when they sang in alternate verses a hymn to Christ, as to a god, and bound themselves by solemn oath, not to any wicked deeds, but to never commit any fraud, theft, or adultery, never to falsify their word, nor deny a trust when they should be called upon to deliver it up; after which it was their custom to separate, and then reassemble to partake of food - but food of an ordinary and innocent kind.

  - The quotations of the Scriptures in the works of the early Christian writers 'are so extensive that the New Testament could virtually be reconstructed from them without the use of the New Testament manuscripts!'

## How Early are the N.T. Gospels?

- Internal Evidence 1 Corinthians 15:3-7
  - For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. 6 After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. 7 Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, 8 and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.

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## How Early are the N.T. Gospels?

- 1 Corinthians written by Paul between 52 55 A.D.
  - no more than 23 years after Jesus' death
  - Chapter 15:3-8 contains an early Christian Creed
  - Notice the phrase 'according to the scriptures'
  - When did Paul learn this 'Creed'? 3 years after his conversion! (Gal 1:18)
    - 5 6 Years after Jesus' Death

## What the Evidence Really Shows



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Paul Travels to Jerusalem and receives a 'Creed' which already references written gospel accounts as scripture (1 Cor 15:3-8)


#### Paul Converted

- Galatians 1:18-19
- historeo indicates an investigative inquiry
- The Creed itself is a FIRST HAND account precisely because Paul received it directly from the witnesses. Peter and James.
- ONLY 6 to 8 Years after the crucifixion and resurrection.
- Hostile witness are still alive providing the equivalent of a 'cross examination'

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made... "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:1-3, 14

"That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life - the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us" (1 John 1:1-2

"You simply do not find this kind of empirical, verificationist language in the Bhagavad-Gita, the Granth, the Tripitaka or the Qur'an. The writers of the New Testament were obsessed with this kind of language because something astounding had happened right in their midst, in broad daylight for all to see.
